Lighting of the Christ Candle

On the eve of our Christmas celebration, Jesus' birthday, we light all of the candles of the Advent Wreath. First we light the candle of HOPE as the prophets foretold the coming Messiah. Second we light the candle of PEACE for Jesus is the Prince of Peace. Third, we light the candle of JOY as the angels announced Christ's birth. Fourth, we light the candle of LOVE because God is love. Finally we light the center candle. This is the CHRIST candle. Jesus is born. Jesus has come. Jesus is our salvation. Sharing of Bread and Cup

Service of Communion in the United Methodist Church

In the United Methodist Church we practice open communion. You do not have to be a member of this church to participate in this service.

We serve communion by Intinction (Latin for “dipping in”). A piece of bread will be torn from the loaf and placed in your hands and then you take the bread and dip it into the cup and then receive the elements. If you are allergic to various breads, an alternative bread is also available in a bowl.

*Lighting of Congregational Candles

The ushers will light the candles from the center aisle. Tilt your candle to receive the flame; straighten it, then offer the flame to the person next to you.
